"Asking For God's Help Against Temptation and Evil"

The Lord Jesus graciously taught His disciples how to pray. I'm glad that His model prayer is recorded for us in Matthew 6:9-13 as well as Luke 11:2-4. We needed specific instruction about what we are to thank God for and what we are to ask God for. The Lord Jesus states it clearly to us in this prayer.

We are told by Christ to ask the Father for three very practical things: 1). daily food; 2). forgiveness for sins; and 3). deliverance from temptations and the evil one. In this issue of the Nortonville News, let's consider the third request, where we are told to ask God: "And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one" (Matthew 6:13)

Just as we need our daily food from God and we need forgiveness for our sins from God, all of us need deliverance from temptation and evil by the help of God. Temptation is "common to every person" (1 Corinthians 10:13), and the evil one is actively, "seeking whom he may destroy" (1 Peter 5:8). We are always to be on guard against temptation and the devil. The spiritual battle that each and every one of us faces is very real.

But it seems so easy for us to fool ourselves into thinking that we can somehow win the spiritual battle by our own strength and our own ability. We too often rely on human wisdom and human willpower instead of God's wisdom and the divine power that only God Himself can provide. So, the first step to victory is to realize that we cannot have the spiritual success over temptation and spiritual wickedness without God's help. That is why the Lord Jesus instructs us to pray about this area specifically. We cannot win against the powers of darkness without the power of the Light of the world. We cannot win by our own natural strength.

It is also important to remember, dear friends, that though God Himself never ever tempts us to sin, God Himself is the One who controls how much temptation we face. When the man called Job was tempted by Satan, the evil one could only do what God allowed him to do to Job (see Job 1:12; 2:6). So, this prayer asking

God to "not lead us into temptation" encourages us to humbly recognize that God Himself is over all things, including the amount of temptation that we face.

We also know from God's word that when we get proud or self-reliant or haughty, Satan is given a place to get a foothold. And if Satan gets a foothold, he will use that to his own advantage. That is what happened to the apostle Peter when he was so sure of himself and his own abilities. Peter claimed before the Lord that he wouldn't deny the Lord. But the record shows, (and God's Word is always true), that Peter was led into temptation and on that particular night denied the Lord three times and did not get the victory.

In and of ourselves we will utterly fail. As our Lord says, "Without Me, you can do nothing" (John 15:5). So let us have the spirit of truth and humility which leads us to pray as Jesus taught us, including in our prayer: "Father in heaven....do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one."


